Here are just a few ways we made Las Cruces, Dona Ana County and the surrounding area healthier in 2017.

Delivering high quality patient care and supporting our physicians

The most important contribution we make to our community is providing high quality care close to home. We are proud to have earned a Leapfrog Grade A national safety rating in 2017 – the only Grade A hospital in Las Cruces. Quality and service are at the center of how we care for our patients, and we continually invest in our facility to ensure we can meet the healthcare needs of our community. In 2017, we made **\$17,532,343 in capital improvements**, including a remodel and new equipment for our Cancer Center, patient room renovations, PICU and NICU patient monitoring systems, 3D mammogram technology and a new hot water boiler.

Inviting the best physicians into our community and supporting them also is a key driver of our efforts to ensure access to high quality care and service. During the past year, MMC added **more than 38 providers** in orthopedics, family and internal medicine, obstetrics and gynecology and hospital medicine; and we introduced new bariatrics services.

Creating excellent workplaces for our employees

We strive to create an environment where talent is recognized, job satisfaction is valued and our **1,324 employees** can effectively use their skills in providing high quality care and service; and we managed and distributed an **annual payroll of \$98,161,548**.

Taking a leadership role in the community

We are proud to be a leader in our region. Supporting local organizations and delivering healthcare to all of our neighbors, regardless of their ability to pay, are foundational to our commitment to the overall well-being of our community. In addition to numerous sponsorships and charitable gifts, we delivered more than **\$4.13 million in charity care to those in need**.

Our commitment to ensuring fiscal responsibility extends both to our hospital and to the community. In 2017, we paid a total of **\$3,226,236 in taxes**.
